The PAH is a major teaching hospital providing comprehensive services to meet primary, secondary and tertiary referrals from both within and outside the District. Annually, the hospital accommodates 75,000 inpatients and 460,000 outpatient occasions of service, and employs more than 5,000 medical, paramedical, nursing and support staff.

As a teaching hospital, PAH undertakes major roles in supporting the undergraduate, postgraduate and continuing education needs of health professionals as well as fostering research into the cause of the disease, its prevention and treatment. These roles are supported by a strong university presence in the hospital's clinical, educational and research activities.

The Princess Alexandra Hospital is the tertiary referral centre for the Southern Zone of Queensland Health. Location 4km from the CBD, the PAH is nationally recognised for its expertise in most specialties and is home to many state-wide services.
